



2025 Fair Camping Rules

YOU MUST CHECK IN AT THE CAMP OFFICE PRIOR TO PARKING YOUR CAMPER.

CAMPING WINDOW CARDS MUST BE DISPLAYED IN THE CAMPER WINDOW.

CURFEW IN CAMPGROUNDS IS MIDNIGHT EACH NIGHT.

AT LEAST ONE ADULT OVER 18 MUST STAY IN EACH CAMPER AT NIGHT.

Please ensure your sleeping vehicles, camper, trailers, etc., will fit in the designated space. Slide-outs and awnings are allowed, but when extended, must fit inside your campsite. If your slide or awning obstructs your neighbors' site, you will be asked to put in the obstruction.

The camping committee reserves the right to move a camper to a larger site to ensure the safety of others and ease of access for emergency vehicles.

Campers cannot be removed until Thursday, August 14, 2025, AFTER 10 PM UNLESS prior written permission (early release form) has been accepted and approved by the camping Chairperson or MCAS President. You will lose your spot if you pull out before 10 pm without an early release form. All early release forms must be received by the Camping chair or MCAS President by Thursday, August 7th at 8pm in order to be approved.

The MCAS Dump Station will not be available for use until FRIDAY, August 15th at 8:00 a.m. There is a traveling dump service by a private party that provides a dumping service to the campers for a fee. You must register for this service at least one day prior, and you are responsible for all fees incurred.

Insurance must be kept on campers while on the grounds.

Campers and trailers must be backed in to aid in removal in the event of fire or another emergency.

You must have a camper in your space, or we hold the right to revoke your camping privileges and put your name on the Waiting List.

Tents are by approval only.

Electricity will be available/turned on at the electric boxes at 8:00 a.m. Tuesday August 5, 2025.

No extra waste containers/blue belly containers permitted.

Campers must leave 36" of space between the camper and the electric boxes. Electric boxes must be accessible with the door open.

All trailers, campers, trucks, or other vehicles used for living purposes during the Miami County Fair must be parked in designated areas only.

All camping sites will be numbered. YOU MUST DISPLAY YOUR NUMBERED CHECK IN CARD IN WINDOW.

The first and last names of all occupants staying in the sleeping vehicles, campers, trailers, etc, must be listed on the check-in form. The person signing the application will be responsible for the names that appear on the application. If any camper is asked to leave the fairgrounds for violation of camping rules,

then all the people on the camper list will be subject to leaving early as well. They will forfeit their campsite for the following fair.

Electric hook-ups are to be proper receptacles only, and only one extension cord per camping unit. Use UL-approved heavy-duty extension cord only.

All premises around camping units are to be kept clean and sanitary. Trash to be placed in barrel containers, and no dumping of any holding tanks will be permitted. **No throwing of trash in manure dumpsters.**

No vehicles permitted to park in the camping area without an appropriate mirror tag (applies to Big 50) or short-term to unload or load.

No continuous water hook-up allowed. Water can be delivered during the fair by our portable dump/water contractor. This service charges an extra fee. You must register the day before to be put on their schedule; no same-day service.

No non-contained, open, or on the ground/grass fires permitted.

Alcoholic beverages are permitted in designated areas only.

No dogs, cats or other animals are permitted to be housed in the camper or in the camping area.

All general rules in the fair book will be enforced in the camping area.



Golf Cart Permit Rules

- 1. Permits can only be obtained with a campsite holder 1 per campsite. We are only accepting the first 75 approved paid permits and must be purchased by June 1, 2025.
- 2. Golf cart check in will be at the camping office on Thursday, Aug 7 between 6:00 and 9:00 pm.
- 3. Permit Fee: \$200 per golf cart for the duration of the fair.
- Golf Carts only. NO ATVS OR SIDE BY SIDES, except for contract service staff or fairboard members.
- 5. You must provide your own golf cart and it must have lights.
- 6. Golf carts can be driven and parked in designated areas only. (maps will be supplied at check in) **Do Not** drive through barricades or gates.
- 7. To operate a golf cart you must be 18 years of age or older with a valid drivers license.
- 8. Liability insurance must be kept on the vehicle at all times.
- 9. Permits must be visibly displayed on the golf cart.
- 10. No golf carts may be operated between the hours of 12:00 am through 6:00 am.with the exception of fairboard members, service contractors on official business, law enforcement, extension agents and first responders unless you are on a verified emergency.
- 11. Only 1 rider per seat. Riders must be seated at all times.
- 12. 5 MPH max speed while driving throughout the grounds.
- 13. No pulling Golf carts may not be used for pulling trailers, wagons, or other items without prior approval except for contract service staff or fairboard members.
- 14. No golf carts permitted in buildings or barns with the exception of emergency medical personnel.
- 15. Any questions or concerns must be directed to the Miami County Agricultural Society Golf Cart Committee.

All rules must be followed or your golf cart and/or your camping privileges may be revoked. If you break any of the rules, you will **NOT** have the privilege to drive your golf cart throughout the fairgrounds for the remainder of fair week Further consequences are at the discretion of the Miami County Agricultural Society.



MIAMI COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1 - Name

The Organization shall be known as the Miami County Agricultural Society, Inc.

ARTICLE 2- Object

- Section 1. The object of this Society shall be to: foster and advertise progress in Agriculture, Education, Industry, the Arts and Sciences, and in the improvement of home and community living to encourage the cooperation of people of all ages to work together in many interests, promote Fairs, Expositions, and all activities possible to benefit the most people, especially the youth of the County. Also, to promote leadership and achievements in all the above-mentioned fields.
- Section 2. The Miami County Agricultural Society is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distribution to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations described under Section 501c(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE 3- Membership

- Section 1. Members of the society are limited to residents of Miami County, Ohio, who are 18 years of age or older and have paid the annual membership fee as set by the board of directors. A printed membership certificate shall be issued to each individual who pays the annual fee. The membership certificate shall be consecutively numbered and pre-numbered corresponding stub from each membership certificate sold shall be kept on file by the secretary of the society and made available to be inspected by any resident of Miami County, Ohio that may request to do so. No more than one membership certificate shall be issued to any one individual annually. Membership certificates shall be issued to individual persons only. Membership certificates may be reissued if the original membership certificate was lost or destroyed.
- Section 2. Membership certificates shall be placed on sale at least two weeks before the annual election and shall remain on sale at least (30) hours each week, at places and times specified by the board of directors, until 5:00 p.m. the day before the annual fair of the society. Notice of the days, hours, and places where membership certificates may be purchased shall be prominently published in the annual premium list and in at least one newspaper of general circulation in Miami County, Ohio, twice during the period of sale, once when they go on sale and again no later than (7) days before the sale ends. Member- ship certificates shall bear the date and time of issue and shall be signed by the purchaser before he or she is entitled to vote at the annual election and/or hold office.
- Section 3. The annual meeting of the Society for the members thereof shall be held at a time and place determined by the Board of Directors. Notice of this meeting shall be announced in at least two newspapers of opposite politics in the County at least two weeks before but not more than four weeks before this meeting or by written notice to each member.
- Section 4. At each annual meeting of the membership, opportunity shall be given to the members to make suggestions for the improvement of the Fair and the Society, also to consider items of business as may be pertinent to this organization.
- Section 5. Voting privileges at the annual election of Directors is granted to all Retired Directors who are residents of Miami County, Ohio and have paid the annual membership fee as set by the Board of Directors. Retired Directors are members who have served 20 (twenty) or more years on the Board of Directors of the Miami County Agricultural Society.

ARTICLE 4- Election of Directors

- Section 1. The board of directors shall consist of two (2) members from each of the twelve (12) townships in Miami County, Ohio and one (1) member from any municipality in Miami County, Ohio not eligible from township representation. Said Directors shall be elected for three (3) year terms. This amendment shall not be brought up for review again until the year 2020 or after if there is a desire for a change at that time.
- Section 2. Members of the Society shall declare their candidacy for the office of a Director of the board of Directors by filing a petition signed by 10 or more members of the Society at least seven days before the election of Directors is to be held. Blank petitions shall be furnished to any member of the Society desiring to be a candidate for the office of Director, said petition to be secured from the Secretary of the Society. Only regularly nominated candidates who have met the filing requirements and deadline will be eligible for election as a Director.
- Section 3. The Secretary shall give notice of the place, date, hours and filing requirements of the Directors' election by letter to each member of the Society, or by publication in two newspapers of opposite politics and of general circulation in the County. This notice shall be three weeks prior to the holding of the election of Directors. (Sec. 1711.97R.C.). Method of notification of the members of the Society to be determined by the Board of Directors. Notice also to be published in the annual premium list if at any time the election is held at the fair.
- Section 4. If any member of the Board of Directors misses three (3) regular meetings per year, that director's status would be up for review by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee may then decide to bring to the entire board a formal vote for removal. Additionally, if any Director is found to be in violation of the adopted rules of the fair, or if he/she does not fulfill their duties and responsibilities for the fair, that director's status would be up for review by the Executive committee and then may be taken to the full

board for a vote for their removal. Upon a majority vote, that board seat will be declared as vacant and a successor may be appointed to serve until the next annual election, at which time, a Director shall be elected to fill the unexpired term. If a Director is removed from the Board, they will be deemed ineligible to seek another board term for a three (3) year period. Newly elected Directors shall take the approved oath of office administered by a competent authority.

• Section 5. The president shall appoint three judges and two clerks who are members of the society and not candidates for election to conduct the election of directors. The judges shall have the member- ship role to determine the eligibility and verify the rights of membership of the society to vote at the annual election. The annual election of directors shall be held on the Miami County Fairgrounds on Monday of the week of the Miami County Fair with polls open not less than four hours between six 6:00 a.m. and nine 9:00 p.m.to be set by the Board of Directors beginning with the election to be held in the year 2007 and thereafter. Only persons holding membership certificates at the date and hour of election may vote. Notice of the election shall be prominently published in the annual premium list and published in at least one newspaper of general circulation in Miami County, Ohio no later than seven (7) days prior to the day of the election. The clerks for the election shall register the names of all persons casting ballots at the election and tally the count. Two copies shall be made and the results of the election. One (1) copy plus the original ballots cast shall be placed on file with the secretary of the society and one (1) shall be mailed to the department of agriculture of the State of Ohio within ten (10) days after the date of the election. The term of the retiring directors shall expire and those of the directors' elect shall begin at the annual re-organizational meeting to be held no later than the thirteenth day of November following the annual election.

ARTICLE 5 – Elections of Officers

- Section 1. Nominations for the office of President are to be made from the floor and seconded. The nominated candidate(s) must accept being nominated prior to voting. If two or more candidates are nominated, a paper ballot election is to be conducted with the elected President receiving the majority of the votes. After a President is elected, nominations for the office of Vice President can be made from the floor. The nominated candidate(s) must accept being nominated prior to voting. If two or more candidate(accept being nominated prior to voting. If two or more candidates are nominated prior to voting. If two or more candidates are nominated prior to voting. If two or more candidates are nominated, a paper ballot election is to be conducted with the elected Vice President receiving the majority of the votes.
- Section 2. The salaries of the officers and Directors shall be set by the Board of Directors following the election of officers, said salaries to cover the term of office the officers are elected to serve.
- Section 3. The Directors shall have the power to replace any officer any time said officer does not fulfill the duties of his office. The charges shall be in writing and be attached to the minutes of the meeting. A majority vote of the Directors will be necessary to replace an officer.
- Section 4. All nominations for officers shall be by ballot. An officer must receive a majority of the votes cast to be elected, therefore if more than two candidates are voted on for the same office and no one receives a majority of the votes cast on the first ballot, the name of the candidate receiving the least number of votes shall be dropped on the next ballot, continuing this manner until one of the candidates receives a majority of the votes cast. Vacancies created by Resignation, Relocation, Death or other circumstances will be similarly filled by the Board of Directors appointment with majority approval. Appointee must reside in the Township he/she will represent. Appointee to serve until next annual election, at which time a Director will be elected to complete the unexpired term.

ARTICLE 6 – Society Constitution, Amendments

This Constitution may only be amended by the society by a majority of the membership, which votes at the annual election of the board of directors. Amendments to this Constitution may only be proposed by a petition filed with the secretary or the society at least fourteen (14) days prior to the annual election of the board of directors of the society. Any such petition shall be (a) certified to be true and correct by the president and secretary of the society and (b) typewritten on 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 bond paper, of each amendment to this Constitution with the department of agriculture within sixty (60) days following the date on which the amendment is effective. The Constitution shall rule unless determined by a proper authority to be contrary to law. For such purpose, the provisions of the Constitution are severable.

ARTICLE 7 – Alcohol Sales

The Board of Directors of the Miami County Agricultural Society may authorize the sale of intoxicating beverages at fairground events and receive revenue from the sales.

ARTICLE 8 – Dissolution of Miami County Agricultural Society

In the event of the dissolution of the Miami County Agricultural Society (MCAS), the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all liabilities of the MCAS in such manner, or to such organization(s) organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization(s) under section 501c(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United State Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the MCAS is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization(s), as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

MIAMI COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1- Quorum

- Section 1. For the transaction of business, one half plus one members' or more at any regular or special meeting shall constitute a quorum.
- Section 2. The board of Directors shall meet monthly on a date set by the Directors. Special meetings may be held when deemed necessary, at the call of the officers, or upon the written request of any six of the Directors.

ARTICLE 2- Duties of Officers

- Section 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, enforce the constitution and by-laws and all other rules and regulations set by the Director's. The President and Vice President shall appoint all standing committees. He is to be custodian of the Secretary and Treasurer's bond.
- Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Vice President to preside at all meeting in the absence of the President and to perform all other duties of the President in his absence, also to serve on the committee with the President in the appointment of all standing committees, and to be responsible for signing checks in the absence of the Treasurer.
- Section 3. and 4. The duties of the treasurer and /or secretary shall be contained in appropriately titled job descriptions reflecting other responsibilities and requirements as are incumbent to the position. Said descriptions, and all subsequent adjustments there-to as necessitated by changes in the administrative structure and/or policies of the Society., shall be approved by majority vote of the board of directors. The treasurer and/or secretary shall each be bonded in the amount of \$100,000.00 for faithful performance of their duties.

ARTICLE 3 – Duties of Committees

- Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Finance Committee to prepare the budget for the upcoming year, to confer with the secretary to determine the kind of advertising to buy and to be the watchdog in the distribution of this advertising to the best of their ability.
- Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to act on business in need of immediate attention or when not necessary to call a meeting of the Board of Directors. All such actions shall be reported at the Board of Directors next meeting.
- Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Ground and Building Committee to see that the grounds and buildings are kept in a clean and neat condition; that the buildings, fences, and other property are kept in proper repair. To oversee the erection of new buildings and other ground improvements.
- Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Auditing Committee to inspect and audit the account books of the Treasurer and Secretary and report the results of its findings to the Board of Directors at its annual reorganization meeting, said report to show statement of receipts and expenditures for the year.
- Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Entertainment Committee to secure suitable attractions and music for the Fair.
- Section 6. The Concession Committee shall be composed of three members, the Secretary, President, and one other member to be appointed by the President. The Secretary shall write all contracts, subject to the approval of the other two members of the committee. Concession contracts shall be in triplicate. Copy No. 1 to be retained by the Secretary and filed for the record, copy 2 for the other party of the contract, Copy 3 for the President.
- Section 7. Any Board member or member of his family, entering any item requiring an entrance fee, shall be required to pay such fee, or be disqualified, also to abide by all other rules and regulations as may be set by the Directors.
- Section 8. The actions of all committees shall be subject to approval or disapproval of the Board of Directors. The transactions and official action of the officers shall be subject to the Board of Directors.





CREATIVE DESIGN: USUALLY SHOWS **RESTRAINT** IN THE AMOUNT OF PLANT MATERIAL AND THE NUMBER OF COMPONENTS USED. THE DESIGN MAY HAVE ONE OR MORE FOCAL AREAS OR NONE AT ALL. THERE MAY BE MORE THAN ONE POINT OF EMERGENCE AND MAY INCLUDE SOME ABSTRACT QUALITIES. RULES, STYLES OR TRADITIONAL PATTERNS DO NOT BIND THESE DESIGNS. THINK —<u>ONE KIND</u> OF FLORAL, ONE KIND OF LINE MATERIAL, ONE KIND OF FOLIAGE--- ALL BIG AND BOLD--- BOLD IN COLOR, LINE AND CONTRAST WITH WELL-DEFINED <u>OPEN SPACES PREVALENT</u>. **DEPTH** SHOULD BE EVIDENT—FRONT, MIDDLE, BACK. **CROSSED LINES**, STEMS THAT SHOW ARE FINE, AND <u>FILLERS NOT NEEDED</u>. **MECHANICS** MAY SHOW IF NEATLY HANDLED AND NOT DISTRACTING TO THE DESIGN FROM 4' AWAY DURING EVALUATION. A GOOD CREATIVE PRACTICE IS: WHEN YOU THINK YOU ARE FINISHED, TRY TO REDUCE SOME OF YOUR MATERIAL--- EDIT, DELETE.

*Contrived Rosette - Flowers from man-made materials; e.g. fabric, plastic, tape, paper. Suggestive of the Grand Ribbon Award given to outstanding entry at county fair shows

*DESIGNER'S CHOICE - ANYTHING GOES FOLLOWING THE DEFINITION OF TRADITIONAL OR CREATIVE DESIGN

*DRIED - CAN BE CREATIVE, TRADITIONAL, PERIOD OR IKEBANA. FLOWERS WHICH HAVE BEEN DRIED BY ANY METHOD; GRASSES, PODS AND SEED HEADS CAN BE USED. MATERIALS SHOULD HAVE NO TRACES OF DUST, DAMAGE, MILDEW, OR INSECT INFESTATION *MASS DESIGN - ARRANGEMENTS IN WHICH A LARGE MASS OF FLOWERS IS EMPHASIZED RATHER THAN THE INDIVIDUAL FLOWER HEADS. IT ALWAYS HAS A FULLNESS AND MINIMUM VOIDS

*CREATIVE MASS DESIGN - A 3 - DIMENSIONAL DESIGN USING LARGE GROUPINGS AND QUANTITIES OF DIFFERENT PLANT MATERIALS AND OTHER COMPONENTS. CREATIVE CONTAINERS WITH MULTIPLE OPENING WILL HELP ACHIEVE THIS BOLD AND FORCEFUL DESIGN. MATERIALS CAN BE BOTH FRESH AND DRIED, PAINTED OR TREATED. OVERALL, THE CREATIVE MASS DESIGN SHOULD HAVE A CLOSED SILHOUETTE, BUT INCLUDE OPEN SPACES WITHIN IT.

*Motion – Implied movement, design is in a fixed position but looks as if all or part of it could move in some manner

***Novice and Advanced -** An Exhibitor who has not previously won a blue ribbon at any Miami County OAGC Flower Shows - All previous winners enter as Advanced.

***PREDOMINATELY -** THE MOST IMPORTANT ELEMENT IN THE DESIGN; THE MAIN EMPHASIS; THE OUTSTANDING <u>FEATURE</u>.

*Reflective Design – Three-dimensional creative design that contains some components that must <u>reflect images</u> <u>AND involve the viewer</u> through the use of that reflection. A complete image of the person viewing is not expected. Reflection may come from shiny containers, mylar, mirror, metal or from convex or concave items can be placed in the design. Not a luminous opalescent design which reflects light but not an image.

***Stretch Design –** Three dimensional creative design using two similar containers where one is smaller and appears to have pulled away from the other by straight connective line material having dynamic tension

***UNDERWATER DESIGN -** A THREE-DIMENSIONAL CREATIVE DESIGN USING ONE OR MORE CONTAINERS WITH SOME COMPONENTS PLACED UNDER WATER TO CREATE INTEREST. THE UNIQUE CREATIVE WAY THE ELEMENTS ARE USED IN THIS DESIGN IS WHAT MAKES IT DISTINCTIVE. THE WATER LINE MAY BE ANYWHERE THAT DOES NOT DISTURB THE RHYTHM OR LINE OF THE DESIGN. NOT A SINGLE BLOOM IN A BOWL; DOES NOT CONTAIN AN IMAL LIFE

- 3. To purchase fair passes, girls need to bring \$2 and any adult may purchase one for \$30. Check or cash.
- 4. All entry forms are due to the fair office, no later than Saturday, July 19, 2025, at 5 p.m.
- 5. Pick up will be Friday August 15th from 8-noon at the Duke Lundgard building.

Awards Ceremony – Duke Lundgard Building – Monday, August 11, 2025 at 7 p.m. for all Grand Champion, Grand Reserve and Honor Rosette winners. All will be notified by phone after judging.

Miami County Agricultural Society JUNIOR FAIR RULES & REGULATIONS

- Entries close for market steer/heifer January 1, 2025. Entries January 2-11 will be charged \$50.00 late fee. Weigh in and tag in is January 11th 10:00 am until 12:00 noon. No late steer/heifer entries allowed after January 11, 2025. Entries for 2026 are due January 1, 2026. Entries January 2-10 will be charged a \$50 late fee. Weigh in and tag in is January 10th 10:00 am until 12:00 noon. No late steer/heifer entries allowed after January 10, 2026.
- 2. ALL OTHER Junior Fair entries close June 1, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. All other entries after June 1st at 5:00 p.m., will be charged a \$50.00 fee per child up until June 10th at 5:00 p.m. All entries will be done online and found through our website. <u>www.miamicountyohiofair.com</u>.
- 3. Definition of Youth Organizations–Only FFA, 4-H, Girls Scouts, Boy Scouts, Miami County Cattlemen's Association, and other organizations upon approval from the Senior Fairboard and Junior Fairboard are eligible for exhibition at the Miami County Fair.
- 4. All livestock and exhibits shown must be a bonafide part of the exhibitor's project for the current year and the exhibitor must have completed any requirements of their respective organization to compete.
- 5. Online Entry must be accurately filled out from the fair website link. Advisors will have access to see forms and receive copies by contacting the office and making a request.
- 6. Junior Fair exhibitors are eligible to exhibit up through but not past the year they turn 19 years old.
- 7. No entry fee will be charged for any entry in the Junior Fair Division as long as the entry is made before the deadline. Junior Fair exhibitors may enter their animal or article in open class where there is a class for such entry by filling out an open class entry blank and complying with the Rules and Regulations for the open class show. These entries must be made on open class entry blanks. Entries made in different departments (e.g. Dairy and Horse) should be made on respective entry forms.
- 8. A separate online entry must be used for each exhibitor except 4-H Home Economics Projects. Entries in each class are limited to two per class per exhibitor unless stated otherwise by the department rules and regulations.
- 9. In a class having only one entry, the judge shall have the right to refuse a first premium award if in his opinion the exhibit/project doesn't meet standards. Exhibits found to be unfit to show or of such low standard as to make questionable the right to competition will be declared ineligible and no award will be paid.
- 10. Every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits and animals from loss or injury; the fair management will not be responsible for loss or injury to animals and exhibits.
- 11. It shall be the duty of the exhibitor to keep his or her animals fed, watered and the stalls, pens, areas, etc. clean and neat along with keeping the area walkway clean and neat around the animals for the entire duration of the fair. Failure to comply will result in the animal being declared ineligible for sales and/or forfeit all premiums and awards. Decisions will be made at the fair, by the Senior Fair Board with support from the Junior Fair Board executive committee.
- 12. All livestock exhibitors in the Junior Division shall be prepared to present a certificate of registration from the respective breed associations for departments requiring so.
- 13. In order to participate in the Miami County Junior Fair Beef Breeding Show, you must show registration papers confirming that they are the breed you are registering them as.
- 14. All market steers, market heifers and market dairy steers, must-have been owned by the exhibitor and under exhibitor's care by January 1, 2025.
- 15. All Horse leases under exhibitor's care by June 1, 2025.
- 16. All market lambs, all beef animals, dairy, breeding goats and market goats, breeding rabbits, horses, sheep breeding, barrows, and dairy steers must be owned and in exhibitor's care by June 1, 2025.
- 17. Market Chickens (White) and Market Ducks must be hatched and in the exhibitor's care by June 16, 2025. Market Geese (Embden) and Market Turkeys must be hatched and in exhibitor's care by March 17, 2025. Market Chickens (Red) must be hatched and in exhibitor's care by April 28, 2025.
- 18. If the exhibitor is raising their market rabbits the bred brood doe must be in your possession by June 1, 2025. If the exhibitor is purchasing their market rabbit it must be in their possession by July 12, 2025.
- 19. All animals must conform to State Health Regulations.
- 20. Showmanship Contest A Junior Fair Exhibitor is eligible to show in a showmanship contest with their animal only. A Junior, Intermediate, and a Senior, and a Showman of Showmen Class will be held as noted in each livestock division, except for dogs and horses. Age for Junior Class is 9-11 years of age, as of January 1. Intermediate Class is for the age group of 12-14 years of age as of January 1. Senior Class is for 15 years and older as of January 1.

Showman of Showmen includes showmanship division winners for this year and any previous year along with any previous Showman of Showmen. Once an age division has been won, you are still eligible to compete in that division until the next age group is reached. The Showmanship Contest is judged on the ability of each contestant to present his animal in the most effective manner to the judge. Animals should be clean and fitted. Cleanliness and fitting will be considered in the scoring. Showman attire: jeans/pants; short or long-sleeved collared shirts, hard soled shoes. NO OPEN TOED or NO OPEN HEELED SHOES. Shirts must adequately cover the body, allowing for modesty. Modesty would include, but not limited to, any low-cut shirts, tops, etc., that would be considered offensive and that would show any cleavage. There shall be no midriff skin visible while showing. Penalty for noncompliance is that the exhibitor will be removed from the show/sale/activity immediately by the Fair Board Member in Charge of the Department. THIS DRESS CODE GOES FOR ALL SPECIES unless otherwise stated. All departmental rules supersede general rules on showmanship, as in rabbits, horses, barrows, and dogs.

- 21. Cowboy hats are allowed to be worn for any species.
- 22. No one under 18 years of age is permitted to stay on the grounds overnight unless accompanied by a parent.
- 23. No Junior Fair articles or animals to be accepted or placed on the grounds prior to Thursday, the day before the opening of the Fair. Inspection will be available all that day. ALL ARTICLES MUST BE IN PLACE BY 10:00 p.m. THURSDAY NIGHT, INCLUDING LIVESTOCK UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED (Example of Goats, Poultry and Rabbits). Only livestock to be admitted after 10:00 pm. will be those having release papers from another fair. (See departmental exceptions.)
- 24. <u>UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED</u>: ALL Miami County Fair Projects, unless removed by sale truck(s) arranged by the MCAS Directors, will remain in place until released based on a staggered schedule by the Sr. Fair Board Barn Superintendent and not released until the sale is over.. All vehicles with/without trailers will follow a one-way map to be posted in the barns for load out. You will not be able to line up until your species is released and the auction is over. Anyone leaving early without written permission from Fair Management may result in a \$50.00 penalty and may result in the exhibitor not being permitted to exhibit the following year. Exhibitor parents will be notified no later than Oct. 1.
- 25. Parking of trucks and trailers shall be in designated areas only, along fences at the North end of the fairgrounds past shade trees. Shade will be reserved for horse trailers.
- 26. Any item or article made by a boy or girl belonging to a supervised youth group in which there is no class provided to show the product in competition, may display the item for display purpose in a booth of the organization.
- 27. Any organization requiring or needing a booth for display should notify the Fair Directors or Secretary as far in advance of the fair as possible. No applications for booth space will be accepted after the date entries close.
- 28. Any student attending Upper Valley Career Center and Miami Valley Career Technology Center whose local school district is not in Miami County cannot exhibit their joint vocational school project at the Miami County Fair.
- 29. No sick animals are permitted in show or sale.
- 30. Grooming chutes in designated areas only.
- 31. All fans must be placed no lower than 48" from bottom of fan cage to floor. No more than 1 fan per 1 animal allowed.
- 32. Junior Fair Exhibitors: Wood bedding is recommended for all species but not mandatory. ALL JR. FAIR EXHIBITORS MUST CLEAN THEIR PENS AND STALLS AFTER THEIR ANIMAL HAS LEFT THE GROUNDS. EXHIBITOR WILL INCUR A FEE FOR ALL PENS NOT CLEANED. Fees are as follows: Horse/Cow stalls/pens will be \$100 per stall/pen not cleaned. Goats, sheep, and pigs will be \$75 per pen not cleaned. Poultry and rabbits will be \$50 per cage not cleaned.
- 33. NO animal is to be west of the sheep, dairy, poultry or swine barns, all animals being walked must use the far East driveway next to 25-A, may go as far South on the driveway as the length of the Poultry Barn, no animals North of the rabbit barn. Do not use the road directly East of Cove Springs Grange. Dogs on day of show: must stay East of the Poultry Barn, not to go North of the Secretary's office, and no further South than the Poultry Barn. All animals must stay away (as much as possible) from all concessionaires. ABSOLUTELY NO ANIMALS PERMITTED IN RESTROOMS!
- 34. JUNIOR EXHIBITORS MUST SHOW THEIR OWN ANIMALS. Exceptions will be made only for exhibitors who may be physically impaired, who have two animals entered in the same class or an exhibitor absent on show day due to other commitments. In case of these exceptions, another boy or girl who is a Junior Fair Exhibitor may exhibit with written permission.
- 35. Make-Up/Show Arena All Species–Only two people other than the exhibitor are allowed in the make-up arena. No one except the exhibitor is allowed near the judge or in the judging area/arena with the exception of exhibitors who

have completed the 4-H Winning Plan Form and it is on file.

- 36. Persons exhibiting unsportsmanlike conduct, or violating ground rules, are subject to removal from fairgrounds, a possible fine, and/or banned from showing that year.
- 37. Any violation of the published rules by exhibitors will result in forfeiture of any and all premiums and privileges.

HOUSEHOLD/FAMILY ENTRIES

The same Junior Fair animals may be entered, and this entry be shared throughout the family for entry purposes at the Miami County Fair. No more than one half of entered animals may be Household/Family Entries.

All family entered animals must abide by all other general livestock rules and regulations. Household/Family consists of members living within the same household and sharing the same legal address and sharing parents by birth, marriage, adoption or cohabitation. Entered animals may only be checked in and shown by one (1) exhibitor during any and all Junior Shows of current fair year.

NO late entries or entry changes will be accepted after the entry deadline (See rule #1). All identification pictures and other required identification must be submitted with every entry form. The exhibitor that is entering the animal must have materially participated in the care of the project.

JUNIOR FAIR RULE VIOLATIONS

In the question of a rule violation the following process will be used; the exhibitor and/or parties involved will be questioned by fair officials. If it is felt that a violation has occurred, fair officials will make recommendations to the designated committee of the agricultural society which is appointed to that particular department. After the committee hears the allegations and or evidence they will decide if the case should be brought before the full board of directors.

In the decision of allegations being brought before the board, all parties involved will be notified of a meeting date with all parties having the right to present their views and/ or evidence. Upon hearing the case, the Fair Board will make the ruling.

When satisfactory evidence has been obtained by the Miami County Fair Management that any of the livestock rules have been violated, the exhibitor and/or the exhibitor's family may be barred from showing at any future Miami County Fair. The minimum number of years for being barred is (3) years before the right to review for reinstatement. In case any premium shall have been awarded to animals shown in violation of this rule the Miami County Fair Management will request the exhibitor to refund all premiums, trophies, awards, ribbons, and sale money under such violation. Unless fraud and/or deception are involved, all championship placings stand. ALL COMMITTEE AND SENIOR FAIR BOARD DECISIONS ARE FINAL.

LODGING A PROTEST

Any exhibitor who desires to lodge a protest with the Fairboard against another exhibitor's livestock concerning a violation of rules and regulations must deposit with the Fairboard sufficient funds to cover the cost of any ex-validity or invalidity of the exhibitor's protest, the cost of the test as determined by an accredited lab, plus a protest fee of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars. In the event the testing results in a finding by the Fairboard that tampering has occurred, the protesting exhibitor shall be reimbursed for the test cost and the protest fee and the exhibitor found tampering hereby agrees to pay for and reimburse Fairboard for the cost of the testing and the exhibitor is subject to any other penalties as set forth in Section 4 of the 2025 Season/Ohio Livestock Tampering Exhibition Rules. If examinations or testing result in a finding by the Fairboard that there has been no tampering as set forth in Section 4, then the protesting exhibitor forfeits all sums deposited.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES

No person who is an exhibitor can act as a judge on the class in which he exhibits or upon stock or articles in which he/she has an interest. Superintendents will indicate to the judge the animals or articles entitled to compete for premiums. If there is any question by the judge as to the regularity of an entry or the right of any animal or article to compete in the class or age, or otherwise, the judge shall report the same to the superintendent in charge for adjustment. No judge is permitted to change an award after the premium ribbon or card has been attached, unless a mistake has been made in placing the ribbon on the card. When animals or articles are not deemed worthy, the judge shall not award a premium.

DUTIES OF SUPERINTENDENTS/DEPARTMENT CHAIRPERSON

It is the duty of each superintendent to see that the department is well filled, to be on the ground early in the morning of the first and each succeeding day of the fair, to take charge of all articles belonging to their departments on their arrival on the ground, to see that they are arranged systematically in their proper places and arrange each kind in a group by itself, so as to exhibit to the best advantage to the spectators as well as to each superintendent must select his judge in reasonable time before the fair and if it is known that said judge cannot be present in time to perform the work assigned him; said superintendent shall select a suitable substitute. No person or persons shall be allowed to enter the fairgrounds for the purpose of organized solicitation or promotion, or for the purpose of picketing, disrupting, for disturbing any concessionaire, tenant or lessee of the Miami County Agricultural Society, or from interfering in any way with any viewer of, or participant in, the activities of the Miami County Fair. Any person entering for the purposes herein before mentioned shall be ejected from the premises of the fairgrounds.



Miami County Agricultural Society Junior Fair Board Constitution

ARTICLE I TITLE

1. This organization shall be known as the Miami County Junior Fair Board

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

2. The object of this organization shall be to promote and encourage agriculture, industry, education, science, art, and other interests of the youth of Miami County, to increase the interest among youth groups for actively exhibiting at county fair time, and to give them a voice in the policy-making of the Miami County Fair.

ARTICLE III ORGANIZATION

3. The members and officers of the organization shall at all times be under the supervision of the Miami County Fair Board with the support of the Miami County Cooperative Extension Service, FFA Advisors, School Supervisors, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and FCCLA.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

4. The board of Directors shall consist of members from each of the following areas: Two (2) from each of the twelve (12) townships of the county 4-H program; One (1) from each of the twelve (12) residential townships; One (1) from each of the county FFA programs; One (1) from each county high school; One (1) student from each Joint Vocational School, such as MVCTC and UVCC whose local school district is in Miami County; One (1) from Boy Scouts; One (1) from Girl Scouts; and Seven (7) members at large. Election of Junior Fair Board members shall be for a term of two (2) years with one half of the board member's terms expiring each year with the exception of at large members. (see #19). This does not prevent the reelection of the member for another two-year term if they do not become ineligible due to age or graduation prior to the end of the elected term, Age of members shall be a minimum of 13 and a maximum of 19 as of January 1 of the current year. Those members in the second year of their term shall be designated as senior members of the Junior Fair Board and those serving the first year shall be called junior members. A junior member has the same privileges as a senior member, Including the right to vote, except that she or he cannot hold an office, or a chairmanship of a committee of this organization, ·

5. The board shall meet in November of each year to select the following officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Each officer shall serve a term of one year.

6. All officers and directors of this organization must have been members of their respective organizations for one year preceding their election and shall continue in such activity while serving on this board. Names of directors and organizations represented must be recorded with the Secretary of the Senior Fair Board.

7. Duties of the President: The President shall preside at the sessions of the board, assign the superintendents to the different departments and see that the rules of the organization are enforced.
8. Duties of the Vice President: The Vice President serves as a department superintendent and shall assume the duties and responsibilities of the president in his/her absence.

9. The Secretary shall keep a record of all the business of the organization.

10.The Treasurer shall report income and expenditures of the organization.

11. Entire selection process for new Jr. Fair Board members (to include any required applications, interviews and notifications to new members) will take place after the county fair within a timeframe.

12. Quorum: The members of the Board of Directors present at a regular or special meeting of which due notice has been given by the secretary by publication or by letter shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business provided the number is not less than 50 percent of the membership.

13. The Board of Directors shall meet monthly from October until the following September with this exception: August meeting is in conjunction with the Senior Fair board Meeting.

14. All officers and directors' terms begin at their election.

15. The position of a board member who has missed three meetings will be declared vacant and two out of the three June, July or August meetings must be attended. Failure to do so will be cause for dismissal from the board. A dismissed board member may apply for reinstatement to the board by appealing to the grievance committee of the Junior Fair Board before the following meeting.

AMENDMENTS

16. This constitution may be altered or amended only with the approval of the Senior Fair Board.

17. Order of business: reading of minutes, reporting of committees, unfinished business, new business, adjournment.

18. Failure to perform reasonable duties assigned to a director by Junior Fair Board President, Vice President or Senior Fair Board advisor shall be just cause for dismissal of that director at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

19. Directors shall be listed by organization in the county fair book.

20. Members at Large: **7** members at maximum should be accepted. They follow the same rules as Junior Fair Board members, except they only serve a one-year term. They must apply to the Executive Committee and will be accepted at the discretion of the same committee.



- All market dairy feeder steers will weigh-in on June 14, 2025. If you cannot make this time, please contact Tom Hines to make alternate arrangements.
- Dairy Feeders must be of dairy breeds or dairy on dairy cross. No beef breeds crosses. If beef cross breed comes into question, a final decision will be made by the Beef Committee at weigh in on June 14, 2025.
- Attention: Per the rules set forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture, to exhibit and/or participate in the livestock sale at the Miami County Fair, Jr. Fair Exhibitors of Market Steers must have completed a Quality Assurance Program.
- Steers will be shown by weight classes. Class listings will be posted in the steer barn as to the breakdown of the show.
- Minimum weight for dairy feeder steers is 300 pounds maximum weight is 700 pounds. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
- Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the fair will be issued a \$4 payment voucher for every head of cattle they show. The voucher must be redeemed at the Secretary's Office before Friday, August 15, 2025 at 5:00 pm.

Jr. Fair Dairy Market Steer Show: Class J-510 - Monday, August 11, 2025 following the Dairy Feeder Calf Show Rules

• All market animals must be dehorned.

- All market steers must be registered by January 1. Late entries will be accepted from January 2 until the second Saturday of January with a \$50 late fee per exhibitor. Please see the Fair website, Facebook page, or your Advisor for information. Weigh-ins will be the second Saturday of January, weather permitting.
- Attention: Per the rules set forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture, to exhibit and/or participate in the livestock sale at the Miami County Fair, Jr. Fair Exhibitors of Market Steers must have completed a Quality Assurance Program.
- Steers will be shown by weight classes. Class listings will be posted in the steer barn as to the breakdown of the show.
- All steers must have been owned and in exhibitors care by January 1, 2025
- Entries limited to three (3) market animals, one or two of which must be heifers. You may enter up to 4 head total.
- Minimum weight for steers is 900 lbs. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
- Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the fair will be issued a \$4 payment voucher for every head of cattle they show. The voucher must be redeemed at the Secretary's Office before Friday, August 15, 2025 at 5:00 pm.

Jr. Fair Beef Feeder Calf Show: Class J-513 - Monday, August 11, 2025 following the Born & Raised Calf Show Rules

- Each Junior Fair exhibitor may enter four (4) beef feeders but may show a maximum of three beef feeders.
- Side photos of the animal & project entry form must also be delivered to the drop off box at the fair Secretary's office on or before June 1 of the current year. Late entries will be accepted from June 2, 2025 through June 10, 2025 but will incur a \$50 late fee entry fee per exhibitor.
- Calves must be sired by a beef bull and out of a good grade beef cow. No dairy breeding accepted.



😘 General Dairy Cow Facts

- Species: Dairy cows are female cattle bred specifically for milk production.
- Life Span: On average, dairy cows live about 4–6 years on commercial farms, though their natural lifespan can be up to 20 years.
- Gestation: Like humans, cows are pregnant for about 9 months before giving birth to a calf.
- Calving: Most dairy cows give birth once a year to maintain milk production.

Milk Production

- Daily Output: A typical dairy cow can produce 6 to 7 gallons (22–26 liters) of milk per day.
- Annual Production: This can add up to over 2,000 gallons (7,500+ liters) of milk per cow per year.
- Milking Frequency: Cows are usually milked 2–3 times a day.

- 5. Each exhibitor will keep their dog on a leash and under control while on the fairgrounds except when participating in a class that is required to be off leash.
- 6. Dogs are not permitted to wear any type of muzzle, prong/pinch collar, or electronic collar while on the fairgrounds.
 Exhibitors will be disqualified if their dogs are seen wearing muzzles, prong/pinch collars, or electronic collars.
- 7. A dog that snaps, bites, or attempts to bite while in the ring must be immediately excused from the ring and then removed from the Fairgrounds for the remainder of the Dog Show.

- 8. Individuals are not permitted to have any discussion with judges at any time throughout the Dog Show. (This does not include discussions or questions during Rally Briefings or Walkthroughs.)
- 9. Dogs are not permitted to be dyed or colored in any way. If coat or nails show any evidence of dye or coloring, the score sheet will reflect a major point deduction.
- 10. Assistance, interference, or attempts to control a dog from outside the ring is not permitted. A judge or show personnel who is aware of such double handling or interference must substantially penalize the dog.
- 11. A 25-point deduction will be made for any dog fouling the ring. The exhibitor and his/her dog are not to be excused from the ring. Judging is to continue once the area is properly cleaned.
- 12. Determinations of the Show Committee and/or Judges are FINAL; Judges' judging and scoring decisions are FINAL.
- 13. There will be absolutely no project dogs permitted on the midway at any time.
- 14. Exhibitors showing dogs will be advised the day of the show where the photos will be permitted to be taken.
- 15. Each exhibitor is expected to clean-up after their dog.
- 16. Junior Fair participants who are exhibitors at the Junior Fair shows will be issued a \$2 payment voucher per dog shown. All vouchers need to be redeemed at the Sr. Fair Secretary's Office by Friday, August 16, 2024 at 5:00 p.m.
- 17. The Miami County fair will provide class placement ribbons, participation ribbons, vouchers, and/or other awards for all active classes.

Definitions:

- "Off-season" is defined as the last day of Miami county or Ohio State Fair, whichever is later, to the following March 31.
- "4H or Jr. Fair Season" is defined as April 1 to the last day of Miami County Fair or Ohio State Fair, whichever comes later.
- "Dog" is a male or female canine.
- Training experience is defined as classes from other organizations and/or other trainers.
- Show experience is defined as 4H, AKC, UKC, or similar venues/organizations.
- Fouling includes urine, feces or vomit. In exceptionally poor ring conditions, judges must confer with the show committee and other judges to determine scoring if fouling should occur.

Health Regulations:

- The Ohio State Fair Dog Project Identification Form and Vaccination Certificate completed and signed by a licensed veterinarian is required for exhibition. THESE ARE THE ONLY CERTIFICATES THAT WILL BE ACCEPTED AT HEALTH CHECK. HEALTH CHECK CERTIFICATE MUST BE IN PAPER FORM. ELECTRONIC COPIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
 - a. These certificates must include ALL information requested in the Identification Form section, completed, signed, and dated by the exhibitor, and signed by the parent/guardian.
 - b. The administering veterinarian must complete the information requested in the Vaccination Certificate section and may modify it as per Rule 3 in this section. Other certificates of vaccination, computerized vaccination records, pet record cards, or kennel records will not be accepted.
 - c. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure all health requirements are met.
 - d. These certificates can be downloaded at: go.osu.edu/osfdogs.
- ALL dogs must have current Rabies vaccinations, administered by licensed veterinarians. Veterinarians must document on the current Ohio State Fair Dog Project Identification Form and Vaccination Certificate whether the exhibitor's dog's rabies vaccination is current by filling in the "date expires" blank.
- 3. ALL dogs must be vaccinated for Distemper, Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Parainfluenza, and Parvovirus by licensed veterinarians. If the veterinarian does not administer certain vaccinations, those vaccinations must be noted by the administering veterinarian, either on the vaccination form or letterhead. The show officials will accept the veterinarian's protocol for their client/patient. For the dog show, all vaccinations must be current through the last day of the dog competition for the current year.
- 4. Health requirements from the Ohio State Junior Fair Dog Show, General Rules must be followed.
 - a. Dogs owned by exhibitor and family: proof of license (ie: purchase receipt) is required day of show at health check
 - b. Dogs being used for Assist Dog Project: For license tag information, Assistance Dogs may be licensed through their respective organizations.
- 5. Any dog exhibiting abnormalities or symptoms of sickness, disease, or parasite infestation, as determined by a veterinarian, will be dismissed from the show and must be removed from the Miami County Fairgrounds or the show site.
- 6. If a dog is under veterinary care for a health condition that is not infectious or contagious, the exhibitor must bring a current health certificate (dated less than 14 days before the day of show) from the attending veterinarian on the veterinarian's office letterhead verifying the condition and treatment to check in on Saturday of Miami County Dog Show.
- 7. All dogs participating in fair activities must be health checked prior to receiving armbands for showing. The health check will be the day of the show with the exhibitor checking in the animal.
- 8. Females in season, pregnant, or lactating will *not* be exhibited.

Dog Eligibility:

- 1. Only domestic dogs can be shown. Wolf and wolf hybrids, and similar hybrids, are not permitted.
- 2. All dogs exhibited must be six months of age by the date of the show. This includes Pilot Dog puppies and other assistance dogs. Proof of age is the burden of the exhibitor or exhibitor's immediate family. Dogs not meeting this age requirement cannot be shown.

Ownership:

- 1. Dogs must be owned by the exhibitor and shown exclusively by the exhibitor during the 4H season. For more information, please see the current Ohio State Fair: Junior Fair Dog Show Rules.
- 2. Dogs under the age of 6 months the day of the show will <u>not</u> be exhibited.

License Requirements:

Dogs must be licensed by the exhibitor and/or the exhibitor's immediate family during the 4H year. For more information, please see the current Ohio State Fair: Junior Fair Dog Show Rules.

Handler's Appearance:

Exhibitors should be neat, clean, and well-groomed in appearance. They should wear clothing that is comfortable to handle in and appropriate for dog shows. Clothing should not distract, limit or hinder the judge's view of the dog. Youth with long hair should tie it back to keep it from interfering with handling or the judge's view.

- Acceptable clothing for all obedience/rally classes includes slacks, dressy shorts, skorts, capri or crop pants, colored dress jeans, collared blouses and shirts, polo shirts, or similar attire, closed-toe shoes, rubber-soled shoes, flats, and similar type footwear.
- Inappropriate clothing includes clothing that is too tight or too revealing, such as short skirts, short shorts, tank tops, halter tops, spaghetti straps, low cut blouses or shirts, shorts hanging too low on the waist, clothing with holes or tears in the fabric, blue jeans, faded or torn jeans of any kind, or other similar types of clothing. Do not wear shirts with club names or logos, or clothing with lettering and distracting or offensive wording or designs. Do not wear hats. Do not wear sandals, open-toed shoes, high-heeled shoes, clogs, or similar type footwear. Exhibitors dressed inappropriately will have points deducted or may be excused from the show ring.

Dog's Appearance:

Dogs must be clean, well-brushed and in good physical condition appropriate for the dog's age. The coat must be free from mats and loose hair. Dogs are not permitted to be dyed or colored in any way. If coat or nails show any evidence of dye or coloring, the score sheet will reflect a major point deduction.

Any dog whose hair surrounding the eyes, ears, or beard interferes with its performance may have its hair tied back with elastic bands or small plain barrettes. Ribbons or bows are not permitted.

Collars and Leashes and Equipment:

For acceptable collars, leashes, and other equipment while in the show ring, please refer to The Ohio State Fair, Junior Fair Dog Show Rules.

<u>Training:</u>

"Off-season" is defined as the last day of Miami county or Ohio State Fair, whichever is later, to the following March 31.

- The exhibitor can only receive outside training for extra training during the "off season"; the exhibitor must only receive training from their advisor after April 1 until the end of the Miami County Fair or the Ohio State Fair, whichever is later.
- Lessons, instruction, and advice for the exhibitor are encouraged. As long as the exhibitor is present in the learning situation and handles or trains the dog the majority of the time present, such assistance can include occasional handling or training by another person.
- Exhibitors will not be permitted to train or practice in the show ring at any time.
- Exhibitors will not be permitted to train or practice on the fairgrounds after August 1 of the current year.

Obedience Rules & Classes: Class 4-H-5 Dog Obedience:

- 1) For explanations of obedience classes, please see the current Ohio State Fair: Junior Fair Dog Show Rules.
- 2) The letters "A" and "B" refer to the experience of the youth and dog. For more information, please see the current Ohio State Fair: Junior Fair Dog Show Rules.
 - a) "A" classes are for handlers or dogs with NO training or showing experience prior to the county's current project year. "A" classes can never be repeated by the same youth, regardless of what dog is shown. "A" classes can never be repeated by the same dog, regardless of what youth shows that dog. Refer to "A" class information in the rules for each show discipline.

- b) "B" classes can be repeated by the same youth regardless of what dog is shown, and by the same dog, regardless of who shows that dog, provided the youth and/or dog are not the class winners (exception: Showmanship). If/when a youth and/or dog wins first place in a "B" class, the youth and dog must move to the next level (exception: Showmanship and specified advanced obedience classes). A dog must move to a higher level within a discipline, once that dog begins performing at that higher level. (Refer to each of the show discipline's rules for rules specific to that discipline.)
- 3) Miami County reserves the right to let the exhibitors show 2 dogs in obedience, either in the same class or in different classes, with the exception of Beginner Novice A.
- 4) Beginner Novice A exhibitors/first year exhibitors are only allowed to show one obedience dog. This rule supersedes The Ohio State Fair: Junior Fair Dog Show rules.
- 5) If exhibitors showing their dogs at any Licensed or Member Obedience Trial or at a Sanctioned Match or equivalent they must refer to The Ohio State Fair Dog Show guidelines.



- 8. Exhibitors may enter up to three (3) goats in the Miami County Born and Raised Show. The three (3) goats must have been shown in either the market show or the crossbred doe show to be eligible.
- 9. Goats not showing in the Junior Market Show will be weighed in at the conclusion of the Jr. Fair Market Goat weigh-in.

General Rules:

- 1. All members that will show a horse at the Miami County Fair will need to attend and successfully complete a "QA for horses" and registration session. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 2. The deadline for entry and additions is June 1st of the current year.
- 3. Late additions can be added up until June 8th, 2025 with a paid \$50 late fee. Late changes must be sent to a Sr. Fair Board horse committee member by 5PM June 8th.
- 4. Shows will follow the current Ohio State Equine Rulebook.
- 5. Each project animal will be awarded a \$4.00 voucher that can be redeemed at the Secretary's Office before August 15, 2025 at 5:00 PM.
- 6. Only Junior Horse show exhibitors will be allowed to ride or school horses in or around the arena on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday until after the show is over for the day.
- 7. All Junior Horse Show Classes will be judged under the rules as outlined in 4-H Circular No. 179 State Uniform Rules for 4-H Horse Shows and all 4-H policies, rules, and regulations will apply.
- 8. Mare with foals or foals are not permitted at the Miami County Fair.
- 9. All horses stalled at the fair must be participating in the Miami County Fair.
- 10. Exhibitors are not allowed to remove their animals early without having written permission (an Early Release form completed). Anyone leaving early without written permission from the superintendent will not be permitted to exhibit the following year and/or will be fined.
- 11. Anyone 4-H age and younger must wear a helmet anytime they are on a horse.
- 12. No horses are to be turned loose at any time.
- 13. Stalls must be kept clean and presentable and be bedded at all times.
- 14. All horses must be in stalls no later than 8PM on Thursday August 7th.
- 15. Advisors and members must be present for check on Thursday August 7th after 8PM.
- 16. Upon departure, all stalls must be stripped and all decorations must be taken down. There will be a \$100 fine for each stall not cleaned.
- 17. No screws or nails are to be used on stalls.
- 18. Sleeping in the barn overnight is prohibited.
- 19. Keep the wash rack clean and free of debris.
- 20. All manure must be dumped in the designated location.
- 21. All barn rules must be followed.
- 22. Review and follow Jr. Fair Rules.
- 23. Release will be 6PM Thursday unless otherwise instructed by a Sr. Fair Board member.

Entries / Possession

- Horses must be owned and in the exhibitor's care by June 1st of the current year.
- Leases must be sent to club advisor and senior fair board horse committee member by June 1st of the current year.
- All online horse entries are due on or before June 1, 2025.
- Project animals must have been listed on the Horse Entry Form no later than June 1st of current year.
- Novice classes will be determined by the seat.

Novice Walk-Trot Class

• Open to all age groups and heights.

- Rider may not have shown in a three gaited (walk/trot/canter) or easy gaited class.
- Any member placing 1st or 2nd in this class will be ineligible for this class in the future; but will be eligible for Novice 3-Gaited.
- May not cross enter into age group classes and are not eligible for championship classes.
- Members are limited to 3 consecutive years of participation in this class.
- Riders may only participate in Western/English Novice, Showmanship, Hitch classes.
 Not eligible for contesting classes, over fences, or any 3-gaited class.

Novice Class (Western /English 3-Gaited and Showmanship)

- Open to all age groups and heights.
- Novice riders must have had extremely limited 3-gaited showing/riding experience.
- Riders may only participate in Western/English Novice, Showmanship, Hitch classes. • Not eligible for contesting, over fences or versatility.
- May not cross enter into age group classes and are not eligible for championship classes.
- Members are limited to 2 consecutive years of participation in this class.
- Any member placing 1st or 2nd in this class will be ineligible for this class in the future.

Equine / Show

- Small equines must be measured in order to participate in small equine classes. If not measured, they are subjected to be moved up a height class.
 - Small equines can be measured prior to the Jr. Fair show. Please contact a Sr. Fair Board member for measurement time.
- Classes with an excessive number of entries may be split or combined at the discretion of the judge and superintendent.
- Time limit for entering the gate: 2 minutes after the first horse enters the gate.
- The Miami County Horse Association (MCHA) runs the Open Show and Speed Show.
- Fun Day will be run by the 4-H Clubs on a rotating basis. The approved Fun Day classes must be followed. \$1 per class can be used by the club(s) running Fun Day to buy supplies and as a fundraiser for the club(s). The horse committee will coordinate each year who runs Fun Day.
- Any official protest will cost \$100.00 and must accompany a written protest before the close of the show.
 Protesters must be an exhibitor in the class being protested.

Sharing Horses

The following guidelines and restrictions established in the policy on horse sharing must be followed:

- a. 4H / FFA members (siblings only) may share one (1) equine exhibit/entry at the Miami County Fair.
- b. Only one sibling may participate in PAS and try to Qualify for State fair with a shared horse project.
- c. The shared horse is a 4H project for both individuals and must be completed by both participants,

separately.

Classes

- A single horse can only be shown in 7 classes per day, excluding championship classes.
- A shared horse may only be exhibited one time per class.
- In the event that multiple siblings qualify for a Championship Class, the family must decide which sibling will participate.

Examples:

- → Western Showmanship 16 -18: If the siblings are 16 and 18, only one participant may show the horse in this class.
- → Western Showmanship: If a 13-year-old and 18-year-old win their class and qualify for the championship class then the family must decide who shows the horse, both participants cannot show in this class.

- All rabbits must have a legible tattoo in the left ear. Tattoo numbers are to be listed when registering your rabbits (during the entry process). Any illegible or non-matching tattoo will result in disqualification and the animal will be sent home.
- At check-in, any rabbit with unfit health conditions will be sent home immediately. This is at the discretion of the rabbit committee. All decisions are final.
- At check-in, the sex (buck or doe) may be changed for junior-aged (under 6 months) rabbits only. No other changes can be made to the rabbits registered.
- Each exhibitor may enter up to 8 breeding rabbit entries. Market rabbit entries will NOT count as one of the eight entries. For example, an exhibitor could potentially bring 12 rabbit projects to the fair (8 breeding rabbits, 2 single fryers, and 2 meat pens).
- Family/household animals may only be shown during the fair by one (1) family exhibitor with that entry listed. If checking on the entry form that a project is for family share, only half of the entries can be marked for family share. For example, if an exhibitor has 4 breeding rabbits entered, only 2 of them can be marked for family share.
- This is not an American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) sanctioned show; however, ARBA rules will be followed as closely as possible.

- Cleanliness of your rabbit cages and proper watering is EXPECTED. If you are asked more than 2 times by the rabbit committee to clean your cage or provide sufficient water, you will be asked to remove your animal from the fairgrounds.
- Cages must be cleaned daily. The walkways need to be kept clean and free of debris (show carriers, show bins, etc.) especially during show times.
- On show days, exhibitors are encouraged to bring their rabbits in rabbit carriers. All travel carriers must have adequate ventilation. Carriers and show supplies must be kept along the sides of the building out of the aisleways.

Dress Attire:

Rabbit showmen will follow the showman attire guidelines in the Junior Fair rules with the following exceptions: If wearing a short sleeve shirt, you must wear a lab coat. If you wear a long sleeve collared shirt you do not need a lab coat. Show aprons may be worn over a long sleeve shirt if you choose. Aprons and lab coats cannot have a name or rabbitry name on them; however, a club name is acceptable. Hard-soled shoes are not mandatory but no open toed or open heeled shoes are permitted.

MARKET RABBITS (Single Fryer and Meat Pen)

- 1. Each exhibitor can show 2 Single Fryer projects and 2 Meat Pen projects regardless of whether it is a homegrown project or a purchased project.
- 2. Market rabbits exhibited at the fair can be raised or purchased. If you are raising your market rabbits your brood doe(s) must be in your possession by June 1, 2025. If you are purchasing your market rabbits, they must be in your possession by July 12, 2025.
- 3. All single fryers and meat pen rabbits must be between 50 and 70 days old on the day of the show.
- 4. No exhibitor is to replace the single fryer or meat pen if it should die.
- 5. Market project weigh-ins (Meat Pen & Single Fryer) is at 8:30 am., Saturday August 9th.
- 6. Single Fryers and Meat Pen rabbits must each weigh between 3 ½ to 5 ½ pounds per rabbit (3# 8 oz 5# 8 oz.) at weigh-ins; re-weighs are not allowed.
- 7. All meat pens/single fryers will show together. Individual classes will not be made. If your meat pen/single fryer is underweight/overweight it will be placed at the end of the class.
- 8. There will be a Homegrown class for Market rabbits. This class is for any exhibitor who had their litter born and raised on their own homestead. All exhibitors who raised their own market rabbits will be eligible to show in both the Junior Fair show as well as the Homegrown class. The Grand and Reserve Grand Champion rabbits from the Junior Fair Rabbit Show *cannot* compete in the Homegrown Class.
- 9. A Single Fryer rabbit may be shown as part of a Meat Pen, but may not show in the breeding classes. Example: You can show a Meat Pen with rabbits A, B, & C. Rabbits A and B can also be shown as a Single Fryers, however, none of these rabbits can also be shown in the Breeding classes.
- 10. All Market Rabbit Exhibitors must complete the Miami County Quality Assurance Certification and record books must be completed. Each animal must also have a DUNF form completed.
- 11. Prizes will be awarded for Grand/Reserve Champion Single Fryer and Grand/Reserve Champion Meat Pen.

BREEDING RABBITS

- 1. Rabbit must be in the exhibitor's possession by June 1st.
- 2. Any breed that has 5 or more entries will have its own class.
- 3. Any breed with less than 5 entries will be shown in a class consisting of the breeds with less than 5 entries. 6-class breeds and 4-class breeds will not be shown together.

- 7. Each breed class has a Champion & Reserve Buck & Doe. Ribbons will be awarded to the top 5 places in each class. Vouchers will be given to all exhibitors each time they show. (Example: If you show a total of 3 rabbits, you would get 3 vouchers.)
- 8. Prizes will be awarded to the Grand & Reserve Buck & Doe in each class (4-Class and 6-Class).

ENTRIES: A \$10.00 entry fee for each lamb entered must be paid and submitted by the breeder no later than the July Miami County Sheep Improvement Association meeting to the treasurer of the sheep association. An entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged to each exhibitor for each eligible market lamb at weigh in. Exhibitors are eligible to nominate up to five (5) lambs and show up to three (3) lambs in the Born and Raised Show provided they meet the eligibility requirements.

Rules:

These under/overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
- Awards to Grand, Reserve and Division Champions. Ribbons to 1st through 6th place in each class.

- The Barrow Show is a partial-terminal show with the Grand Champion barrow and the Reserve Grand Champion barrow being slaughtered.

- In a continuing effort to assure quality in the food product to the packers and ultimately the consumer, drug use notification forms will be completed on each market animal exhibited at the Miami County Fair.
 - Each exhibitor must have completed necessary training, applied for and received Pork Quality Assurance Level 3 status prior to June 30th, 2025.
 - Be prepared to provide verification of the Quality Assurance training completion.
 - Follow health rules 901:1-18-102c found in the Junior Fair Book.
 - Water only to be used on market barrows. No oil is permitted.
- Arrival time for barrows will be: 10:00 p.m. Saturday and no later than 9:00 a.m. Sunday.
- Exhibitors delivering barrows should enter the fairgrounds at the main gate on County Road 25-A.
- All livestock trucks and trailers that will be left at the fairgrounds during the fair are to be parked at the far North parking lot along the fence.
- Barrows must be on the grounds by 9:00 a.m. Sunday. There is a mandatory swine barn meeting at 9:45 a.m. on Sunday.
- The weighing will start at 10:00 a.m.
- Barrows must be in their pens during the meeting, as weighing will start promptly.
- Failure to have hogs in pens will result in those hogs being weighed last and therefore selling last.
- All animals are to be clean at the time of weigh in.
- All barrows will be weighed one time with that being the official weight. Barrows NOT meeting the weight requirements of 200-300 lbs. will have the opportunity to reweigh one time, within an hour of initial weigh in.
- These weights will determine the class for the show.
- If you don't want your hogs in the same class, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have the weights different by at least 5 lbs.
- Hair on all barrows will be a minimum of one half (½) inch (excluding ears and tails). Any barrow with hair shorter than (½) inch will be disqualified from the show and sale.
- Barrows will be shown in classes by weight and breed. Registration papers will be required to show in purebred classes at the time of weigh in. Division of purebred classes will be at the discretion of the swine committee. All barrows without papers will be shown as crossbreds.

2. The individual providing the state issued ID is the responsible party for all purchases made with that buyer's number during the 2025 Miami County Jr. Fair Livestock Sales.

a. Any registered buyer representing a group such as 'Friends of Sammy Showman' is responsible for <u>full payment</u> by September 20. Individuals or businesses within that group will not be separately billed or recognized individually in any of the Livestock Sale listings. Recognition will only be given to the 'group name' given at time of registration. In a group such as this, only the registered buyer will receive the benefit of fair day-passes for the following year.

3. All lots are 'sold' as non-terminal, with the exception of the Champion animals

a. The Ohio Department of Agriculture requires that the Champion and Reserve Champion market beef, market dairy steer, market lamb, market hog, and market goat all go to harvest.

4. All bids are Premium Bids

a. In our premium sale, the weight and market price of the animal are irrelevant, since the actual animal is not being 'sold' (with the exception of the Sale of Champions if custom processing is desired). Therefore, it is not an option for a Buyer to 'Pen' an animal.

b. The Premium is passed on to the Exhibitor after the sale has been processed and sufficient funds have been collected from the buyers.

5. Sale of Champions

- a. A buyer of a Champion animal needs to inform the exhibitor directly following the sale if custom processing is desired. Sprankle's Butcher Shop or Kenny Wheelock need to be contacted immediately if custom processing is wanted by either the buyer or exhibitor.
- b. In the Sale of Champions, whomever receives the meat will be responsible for the market value of the animal.
- c. In the Sale of Champions, the winning bid will determine if a 'record has been broken'. Add-ons to Champions will not be considered in the 'recorded total' since they can be given after the completion of the live sale.

8. Add-ons remain online transactions only. If you need assistance making Add-ons online, there will be support staff available the day of the live sales. Add-ons for all animals may be completed online at

www.miamicountyohiofair.com with payment by credit card from August 14, 2025 until August 25, 2025.

Terms & Conditions:

- All purchases must be paid in full by October 1, current year. October 2nd and after, a late fee of 2% will be added on the 1st of each month until the account is paid in full. If payment is not received by December 20, 2025, MCAS reserves the right to BAN the buyer at future Jr. Fair Livestock Sales. Accounts not paid by October 2, 2025 will have the amount unpaid deducted from the exhibitor's check.
- 2. All buyers are encouraged to make full payment on Auction Day.
- 3. Checks are payable to: MCAS, or the Miami County Agricultural Society.
- 4. Credit Card payments will be accepted on Sale Day with a 4% convenience fee added to the total amount.
- 5. Buyers not settling accounts on Auction Day will be mailed an invoice with a due date of October 1.
- 6. Payments may be dropped off in person to the Secretary's office Tuesday-Thursday from 11:00am 6:00 pm. A drop box is also available 24/7, in which we will then email or mail out your receipt.

Exhibitor Information

Exhibitors:

We are returning to a live Jr Fair Livestock Sale on Thursday of the fair! <u>Please read through carefully</u>! The Sr. Fairboard Livestock Sale Committee is providing the 'platform' for the exhibitors to publicly receive premiums from supporters within the community. It is up to the exhibitors and their families to educate and encourage buyers to come and support the hard-working 4-H and FFA youth of Miami County. <u>Just because an Exhibitor is registered for the Add-on sale does not guarantee they will receive a check.</u>

- 1) The Premium Livestock Sale on Thursday is a non-terminal sale. With all projects remaining the property of the exhibitor, it is your responsibility to make your own arrangements for slaughter, sell to an individual/agent for slaughter, or to take it home.
- 2) Jr. Fair market exhibitors may only sell one (1) animal either through the Jr. Fair Premium Market Sale or Sale of Champions
 - a) Any Exhibitor with more than one champion or reserve champion will be permitted to sell those animals in the Sale of Champions
- 3) Underweight and overweight animals are not eligible to sell in the live sale, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-on sale if the exhibitor registered.
- 4) Premiums and add-ons are passed on to the Exhibitor after the sale has been processed and sufficient funds have been collected from the buyers, with a 3% sale charge subtracted from your sale total
- 5) Any exhibitors who have supporters with accounts outstanding on October 2 will have the unpaid amount deducted from their check
- 6) For participating species, Born & Raised Champions will be sold at the beginning of their species sale on Thursday. All other sale animals will be sold by their previously given sale number.
- 7) Any market exhibitor who wants to participate in the live auction needs to declare that at weigh-in
- 8) Any market exhibitor who does *not* want to participate in the online sale needs to indicate that when completing their fair entry
- 9) Any market exhibitor who wants to truck their extra animals MUST declare that at weigh-in
- 10) Due to time restraints, the auctioneers cannot share with the crowd any requested comments or achievements concerning individual exhibitors during the Thursday Jr Fair Livestock Sale.

11) The Sale of Champions

- a) Remains a terminal sale for market beef, market dairy steer, market lambs, market hogs, and market goats
- b) In this sale, the winning bid will determine if a 'record has been broken'. Add-ons to Champions will **not** be considered in the 'recorded total' since supporters can give after the completion of the live sale.
- c) In order for a new market livestock class to have their champion and reserve champion animals included in the Sale of Champions, there must be a minimum of 15 exhibitors for five consecutive years
- d) Any market class whose number of exhibitors drops to 10 or below for three consecutive years will not be included in the Sale of Champions.
